DACC Continues to Provide Sheltering for Those Affected by the Lake Fire

The Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC) continues to provide safe sheltering for animals as a result of the recent Lake Fire.

DACC is currently sheltering 67 animals (16 Horses, 16 Goats, 15 Chickens, 3 Roosters, 2 Ducks, 7 Ponies, 2 Pigs, 5 Sheep, and 1 Peacock). These animals are located at the Antelope Valley Fairgrounds located at 2551 W. Ave, H Lancaster, CA 93536. DACC is currently accepting additional animals at all evacuation sites.
