Thanks to a generous donation from the Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation, play yard renovations are currently underway at the Downey Animal Care Center. These renovations will include new fencing, gazebos, and the installation of synthetic turf. The new play yards will be cleaner, more comfortable for the dogs, and will include onlooker seating for the visiting public.



Play yards allow dogs to exercise and socialize outside of their kennels regularly, which is crucial to promoting their emotional and physical wellbeing. Daily exercise and time out of the kennel reduces anxiety and stress for dogs, thereby allowing DACC's behavioral team to more accurately assess each dog's unique personality. Since relaxed dogs present better to the public, these new plays yards will also increase the potential of dogs being adopted into loving permanent homes!


A NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER
