

PET LICENSE AMNESTY PROGRAM

The Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC) is waiving late fees for renewed or new pet licenses paid for by June 30th by pet owners in unincorporated areas and participating cities within Los Angeles County (Agoura Hills, Azusa, Bell, Carson, Hidden Hills, Inglewood, Irwindale, La Habra Heights, Malibu, Maywood, Monterey Park, Palos Verdes Estates, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, Walnut, and Whittier). These pet owners will also be eligible for a free microchip for their licensed pet, redeemable at any County Animal Care Center.

The amnesty program and free microchip incentive will allow more pet owners to maintain compliance with pet licensing and microchip mandates despite the economic downturn brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. Pet licensing, rabies vaccinations, and microchipping ensure public health and quicker return of lost animals while providing revenue to support animal care and control operations.

The Department celebrated our Animal Control Officers (ACO) during National Animal Control Officer Appreciation Week, which is held every year during the second full week in April. 

Newly Renamed "PetcoLove" Foundation Invests in Lifesaving Work of DACC

Grant of \$75,000 will help save more pets in Los Angeles County

The Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation has applied for and received a \$75,000 grant from Petco Love (formerly the Petco Foundation) to continue to support DACC's lifesaving work for animals and pet owners in Los Angeles County. The funds will be used to increase adoptions across our seven animal care centers through new marketing, promotions, and reduced adoption fees. The grant will also be used to assist pet owners with free pet food, supplies, and other resources such as medical care or temporary boarding to help allow people to keep their pets no matter what challenges they face. This kind of support is a critical need as the pandemic has left many pet owners in our communities struggling to care for their pets.

Petco Love is a nonprofit leading change for pets nationally by harnessing the power of love to make communities and pet families closer, stronger, and healthier. Since their founding in 1999 as the Petco Foundation, they've empowered organizations with nearly \$300 million in adoption and other lifesaving efforts, helping to find loving homes for more than 6.5 million pets.

"Today Petco Love announces an investment in the Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation and hundreds of other organizations as part of our commitment to create a future in which no pet is unnecessarily euthanized," said Susanne Kogut, President of Petco Love, on April 15.
